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Writing an Essay (1/4)

- A critical essay should be based on all the following:
 - lectures by Roberto Evaristo
 - course material (articles)
 - other scientific articles that you should search for
- In addition, if you have experiences e.g., on working in a distributed project you can compare your experiences to the literature and lectures.

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Writing an Essay (2/4)

- Topic: choose 3-4 of the main topics presented during the lectures
- On each topic present:
 - some of the most important or interestings themes discussed during the lectures and in the literature
 - critically compare what different authors present
 - give also your own justified comments and opinions
- On each topic you can also try to identify issues that are:
 - especially problematic for distributed projects
 - important to remember when managing distributed projects
 - topics that would need further research
- If possible you can include also your own experiences, even though the literature should play the major role



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Writing an Essay (3/4)

- On each topic (3-4 topics) you should find, besides the articles offered by the course, 2 or more scientific articles that you reference to
 - You can search for those articles from the electronic databases of HUT library (<u>www.lib.tkk.fi</u>).
- The length should be 5000-6000 words with line spacing of 1,5 (approx. 15 pages)

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Writing an Essay (4/4)

- Pay attention to the way the information is presented, each context should show whether the information in question is
 - based on a literary source (the source must be given as a citation)
 - research result based on empirical data collected by the author
 - based on experiences of the author
 - deduction of the author
 - assumption of the author
 - guess of the author
- Present your personal thoughts, information, assumptions, and guesses whenever possible
 - clearly identify these, e.g. "In my opinion...".
