MaPIT – Management, Processes, and IT Support for Globally Distributed Software Development

Global distribution is becoming a mainstream way of organizing software development projects. By global distribution, companies are trying, e.g., to cut software development costs, to get access to competent labor, and to shorten the time-to-market for their products. In many cases the benefits are supposed to be realized in a short period of time. As a consequence, many of projects neglect building true collaborative relationships and collaboration practices within the project team.

Agile software development is another currently hot trend that is also being applied to globally distributed software development. The challenge is how to combine agile practices, originally intended for collocated work, and the highly distributed nature of global software development.

In this seminar, the MaPIT research project of TKK presents the newest findings on how to build collaborative relationships in global software engineering. What kind of collaboration and communication practices and tools are most effective for different kinds of distributed projects? How can agile software development and global distribution be successfully combined?

The MaPIT industrial partners Tieto, IBM and Vaisala present their experiences and solutions on how to build successful cooperation in globally distributed software development projects. They also discuss their views on the future of global software development.
